

Minimum Technical Specifications Donations/Contributions of Computer Technology

The Jackson Public School District recognizes the key role that concerned citizens and business partners must play in the acquisition of technology for school programs. However, some contributions of technology are out-of-date, unusable with current software requirements, require technical services that may or may not be available in our district. or force the District to incur an additional cost to use the donation. Listed below are the Minimum Standards for Donations/Contributions of computer technology. All donations must be pre-approved by the Executive Director of Information Technology Services.

System Memory (RAM)	8 GB or more
Hard Drive	256 GB SSD

Screen Size (Desktop)	17 inches
Network	802.11 N, AC (if wireless available), 100/1000 MB/sec (Gigabit) Ethernet
Camera	1080p camera with dual microphone
Audio	HD 2 internal 2Wx2 speakers
Graphics	Integrated Intel UHD Graphics 630
Must include all power cords and monitor cables. Must include mouse and keyboard.
