Attendance for Secondary Scholars

Synchronous Online – Scholars attending school virtually will log in to the Learning Management System (LMS) during homeroom. Attendance will be taken in the scholar information system during that time by the teacher.

Freckle differentiates instruction across Math, ELA, Social Studies, and Science by reaching all students at their own level. All students are required to have at least 300 minutes a week in Freckle. 150 minutes should be spent in Math and 150 minutes should be spent in ELA. Students receiving Math or ELA intervention are required to spend an additional 150 minutes a week in Freckle for each subject.
