Skills and Assessments

Reading/Language: Scholars will use context clues to determine the meaning of unfamiliar words and distinguish information from words and from visuals. As well as identify the main idea and key details. Scholars will correctly identify and communicate matching nouns and verbs, and identify and use conjunctions correctly.

<u>Math:</u> Scholars will explore counting to 120 and understand 10 more and 10 less.

Social Studies: Scholars will understand more ways that humans and animals communicate "How We Express Ourselves".

<u>Science:</u> Students will demonstrate an understanding that light is required to make objects visible.
