




In what setting type is the program delivered?






Primary Sources of Funding







2022 Survey Results


Most pressing needs of the children served in your Afterschool program:

Competitive grant program to address students academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs that the state is developing. Modeled after 21st CCLC.
